Town Supervisor Catherine Fedler called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM and led in the Pledge to the Flag.

#### **Approving of minutes**

#### Resolution #28

Auctions International. Jim Buckley Jr. Highway Superintendent said that he would like to get \$50,000 but lucky if get \$40,000.

### **Tri-Town Picnic - Jackson Picnic**

Supervisor Fedler mentioned the Town Picnic and how the Town of Jackson was inviting the 3 towns to combine. Which would be called the Tri-Town Picnic Cambridge, Jackson & White Creek. The picnic would be on Friday, July 25<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM at Cambridge American Legion Pavilion. The Supervisor had asked if Irene Headwell had contacted the Town Clerk. Heather Greenawalt the Town Clerk mentioned that she had and she would be reaching out to Councilman McIntosh about possible music. Councilman McIntosh said that he had already been in touch with someone.

The Town Board discussed the Planning Board suggestions for new requirements that will now be required on survey maps. The Board thought that suggestion 1 and 2 were good however suggestion 3 they thought that the Right to Farm Law be added so that people are aware of the Law. Councilman Bailey mentioned that for the 3<sup>rd</sup> bullet be more specific and put whatever requirements that Easton has. The Town Board requested that these suggestions go back to the Planning Board.

# **Assessor Report**

Grievance Day was held on Wednesday, May  $28^{th}$  at 4:00-8 pm. Had 18 come to Grievance Day and total of 22 residents summit application. Amy Clark the new BAR member was a good fit to the BAR. Notice of Determinations of BAR will go out by the end of the month. A quote was received for the .gov emails and the cost is approximately \$45.54 /yr per person, which would end up being \$3.795 per month per user for the townofcambridgeny.gov. It was figured that total would be approximately 15 individuals (employees). It is just a question of whether want to spend money and how many seats want.

The Supervisor mentioned that she realized when County Supervisor was gathering info on salaries from different towns for 2022-2024 that one of the Highway jobs had not been increased for pay raise. Supervisor Fedler realized that year-round parttime position did not go up when did the second increase in pay last July 2024. This will need to be increased or corrected this year.
